CYS opens season at peace center october 21

CYS Alumnus Dr. James Stokes on Trumpet

We are very pleased to announce our opening concert for the 57th season of the Carolina Youth Symphony. This series of concerts is highlighted by our fifth trip to perform at historic Carnegie Hall in New York City.

For our first concert, we are again privileged to be performing in the main hall at the Peace Center in downtown Greenville. This is a world-class concert hall and it is a real treat for our students to play in this facility.

We are very proud to present as our guest soloist Dr. James Stokes, professor of trumpet at Appalachian State University. Dr. Stokes is an alumnus of CYS and we are obviously very proud of his professional accomplishments both as a teacher and as an artist. He will be featured as a soloist on a performance of the Bohme *Trumpet Concerto in F minor* and Copland's beautiful tone poem, *Quiet City*.

For this program, the Carolina Youth Symphony Orchestra will open the performance with Saint-Saen's *Marche Militaire Francaise* from his *Suite Algerienne, opus 60*. We will also present Gabriel Faure's *Pavane* and *Polovtsian Dances* by Russian composer Alexander Borodin.

Our concert at the Peace Center will begin by featuring both our Repertory Orchestra led by Ginger Greer, and our Concert Orchestra conducted by Jim Kilgus. They will present music by Bizet, del Borgo, Berlioz, Wagner, and Rimsky-Korsakov.

Please come and share with me the music making of our talented young musicians as we begin our concert season. We will look forward to seeing you at all of our performances throughout the year.

Carnegie Hall Here We Come

Returning for an unprecedented 5th performance in NYC's acclaimed Carnegie Hall, CYS will depart Greenville, SC on the morning of March 28th with 3 buses and 102 travelers, 91 of them young musicians. We will have 4 string basses, 10 cellos and a harp making the trip to the "big city". A visit to the Natural History Museum, the Empire State Building, Lincoln Center, Juilliard Music School, St. Patrick's Cathedral and a Broadway play will be some of the excitement included on the trip. Of course the focus of the trip will be two rehearsals, a dress rehearsal in Carnegie Hall and the performance itself Sunday afternoon, March 31st. Following the concert we will head to a dinner cruise on the Hudson River and then back to the hotel to pack. Leaving the city in darkness we will arrive back in Greenville exhausted but exhilarated knowing we have participated in the single most significant musical moment of these young people's lives.

JAMES STOKES FEATURED IN FALL CONCERT

Dr. James Stokes, a former member of the Carolina Youth Symphony, is the Associate Professor of Trumpet for the Appalachian State University Hayes School of Music. He holds Doctoral and Master's degrees in performance from The Ohio State University and a Bachelors degree in music education from Indiana University where he studied with the renowned trumpet pedagogue William Adam. He has performed with the Columbus, Charlotte and Asheville Symphony Orchestras, the CAPA Broadway Show Series and was recently appointed co-principal of the Symphony of the Mountains. He has been a featured artist across the US, Australia and China as a soloist and clinician. James serves as an adjudicator and an artist performer for the National Trumpet Competition and is an active member of the International Trumpet Guild. James is a founding member of the Cathedral Brass Ensemble and the New River Brass Ensemble. He is an Artist/Clinician with the Vincent Bach/Selmer Corporation.



When asked about his experience in CYS, Dr. Stokes replied "I remember the inspiring CYS concerts and rehearsals as one of the founding musical experiences of my career. 'Thank you CYS!'"
